Prayer Leader:

Let us pray: "This is what we are all about: we plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water the seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We cannot do everything, and there's a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and to the rest. We may never see the end result, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capabilities." Including these 'seeds' we now name aloud or silently...

Circle prayer:

Going around the circle, each are invited to share in a word or phrase one area of your life where you long for God's help to keep on keeping on. You may "pass for now" and we will return to you before continuing or you may "pass" altogether. After all have had an opportunity to share, then close with...
