Featured Ministry: Veterans Ministry

This week St. Jude's honors the Veterans Ministry.

For more than a decade the Veterans Group Ministry at St. Jude's has provided support to active duty military personnel through the Adopt-A-Chaplain program and homeless vets at the HomeFirst Shelter in San Jose. Currently, as a result of a formal agreement between St. Jude's and the Office of Veteran Services at De Anza College, the group is working to establish a link to veterans who are attending classes at the college. As part of the support under the Agreement, the St. Jude Veterans Group has committed to provide tutoring on an as-needed basis, assistance in developing resumes, and periodically hosting a luncheon in the Parish Hall for the veterans attending the college. In September the Veterans Group prepared and served a BBQ lunch to over 25 students and staff from De Anza. In addition to the BBQ lunch, the De Anza College Veterans Services Department held its annual Certification and Benefits workshop for incoming and returning student veterans in the Parish Hall.
