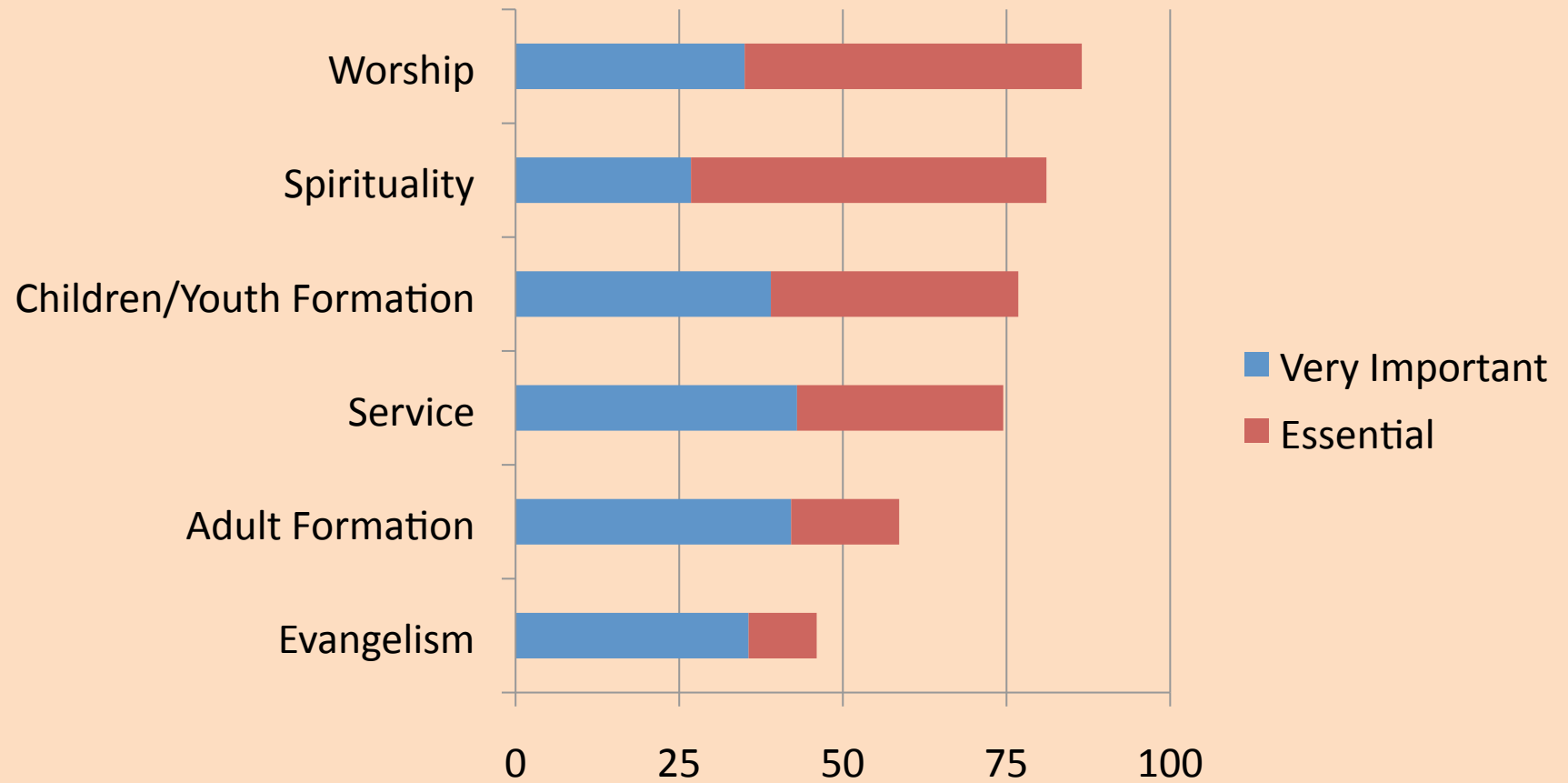
Active participants

- 77% participate in other activities at least 1/month, 34% more than 1/week

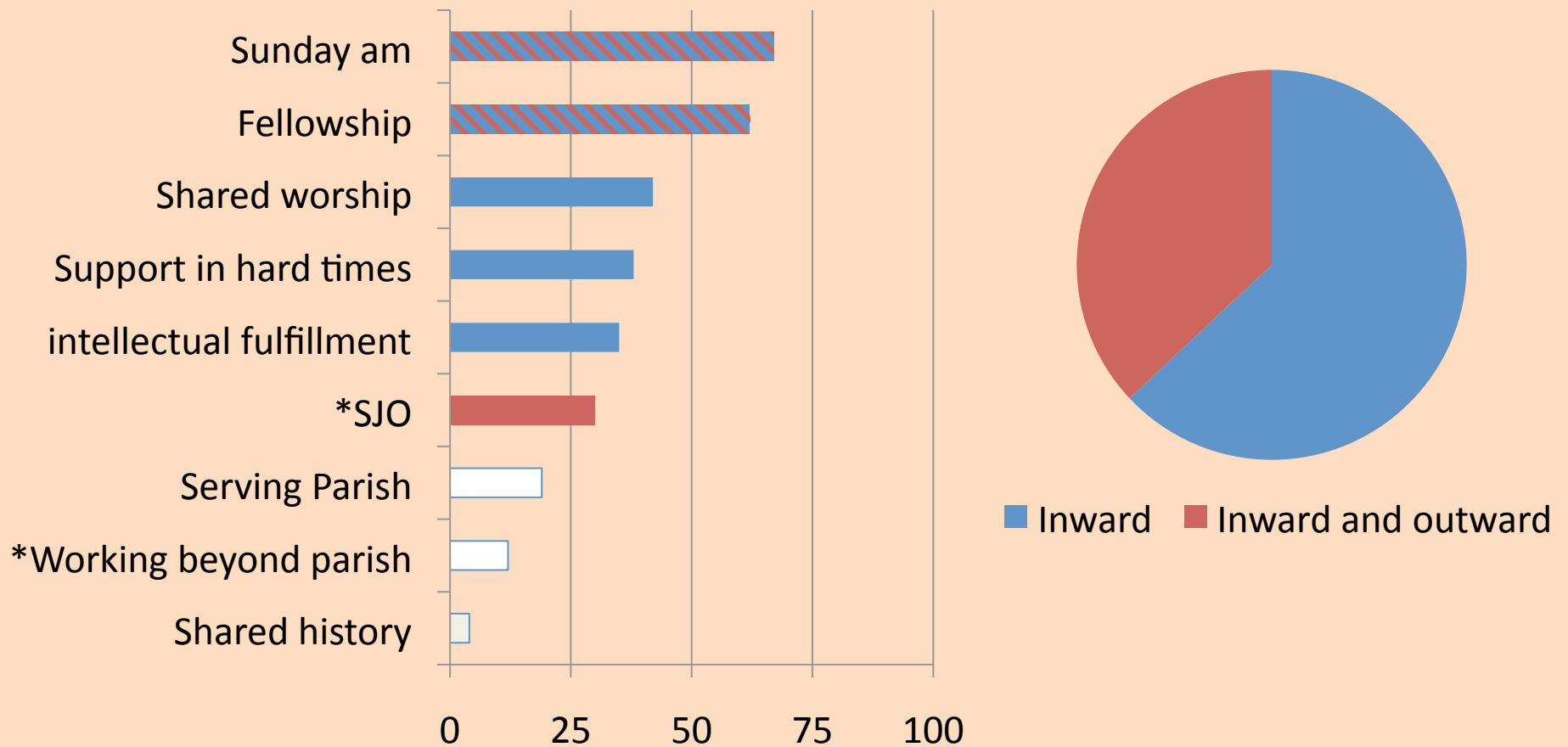
Representative distribution of age, gender, time at St. Jude's

Most important aspects of St J (pick 3)



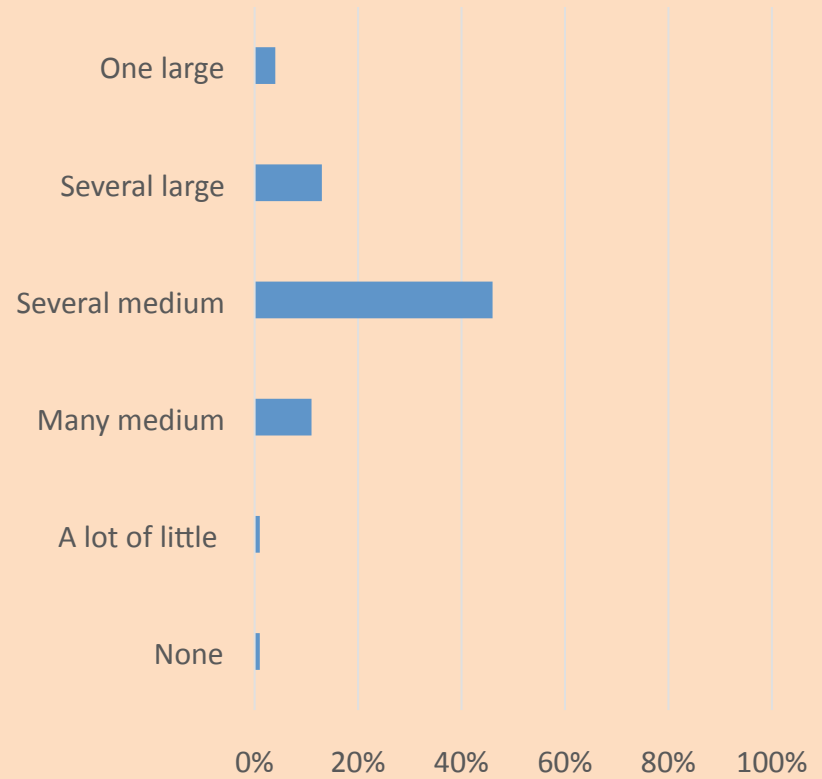

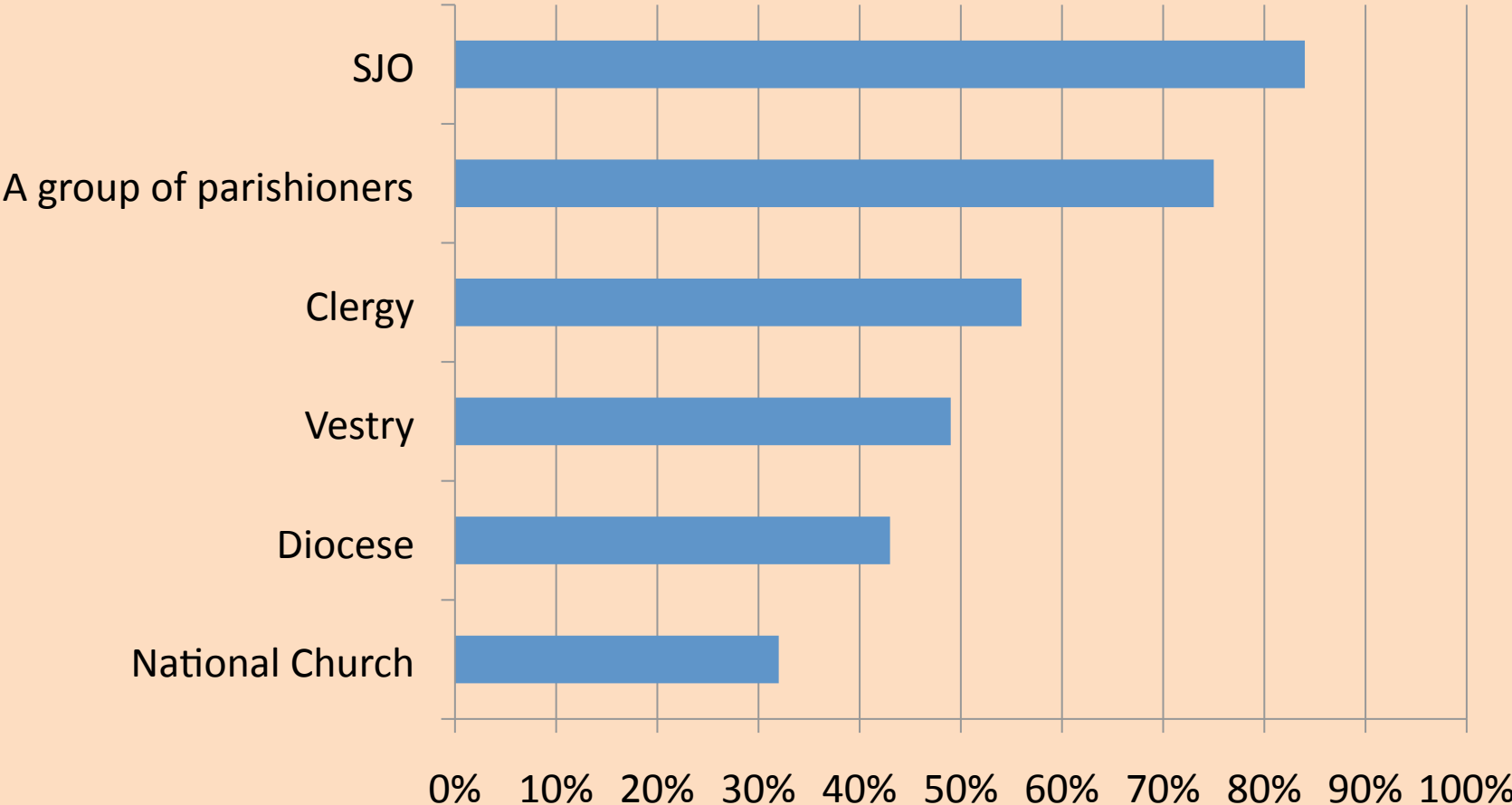
Types of Service Projects



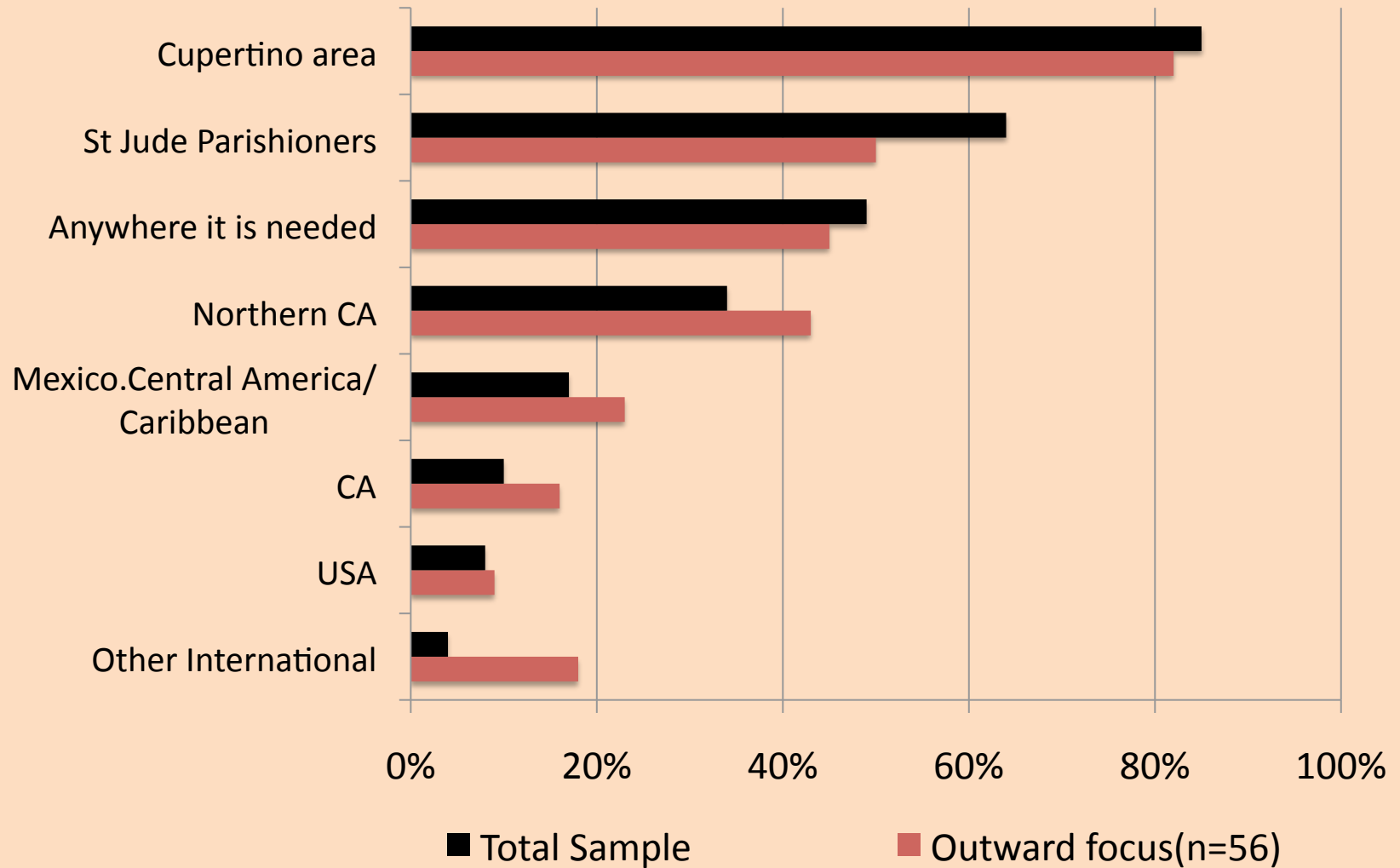
Number of Service Projects



Who Decides Service Projects?



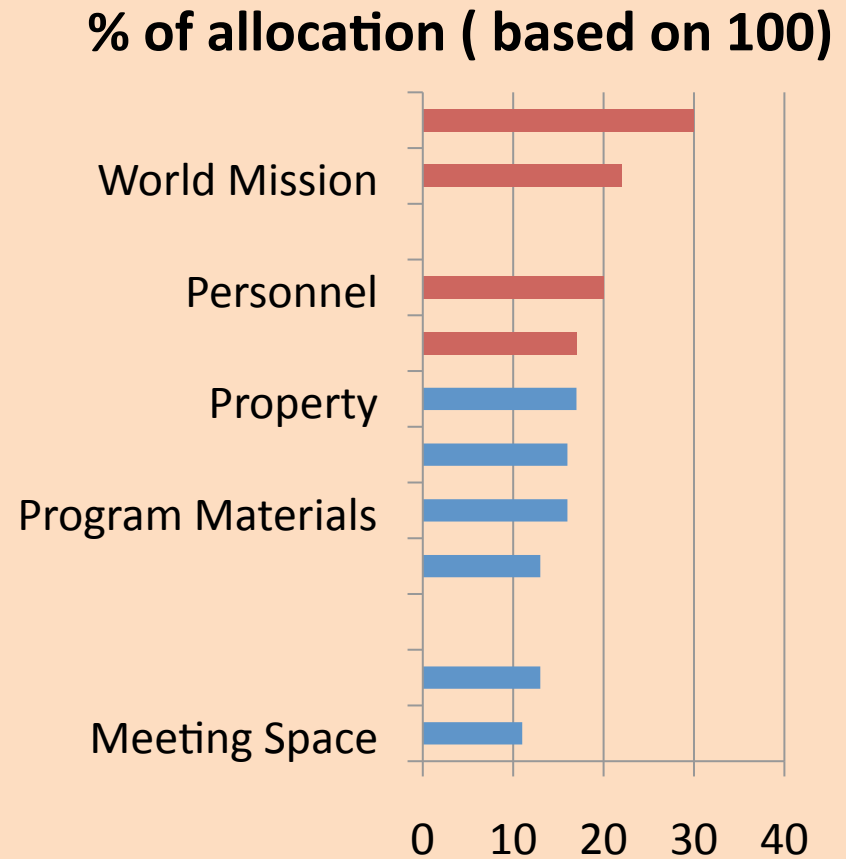
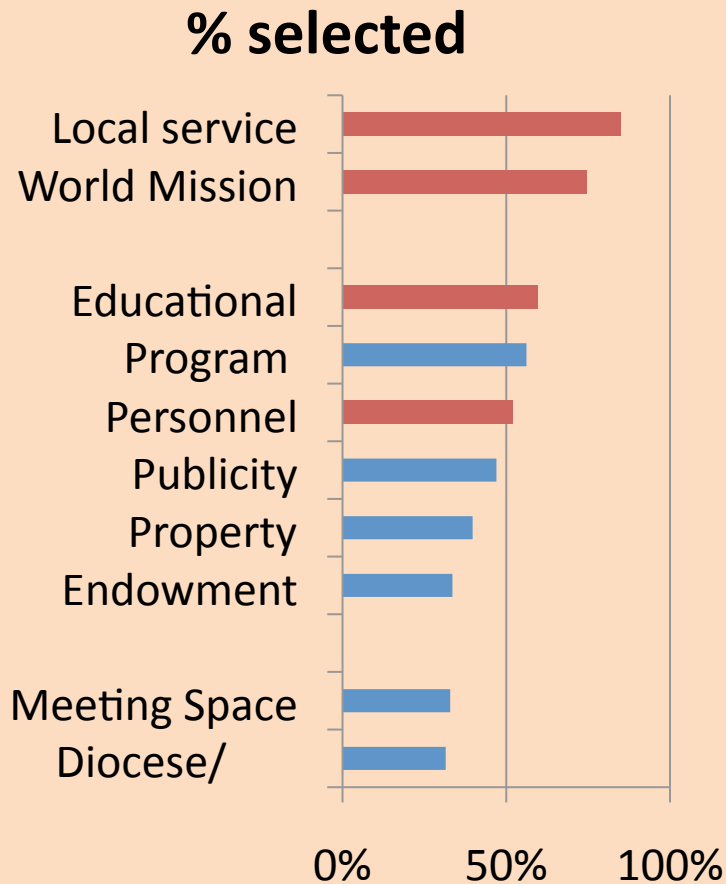
Location of Service Projects

Service as part of Budget Allocations

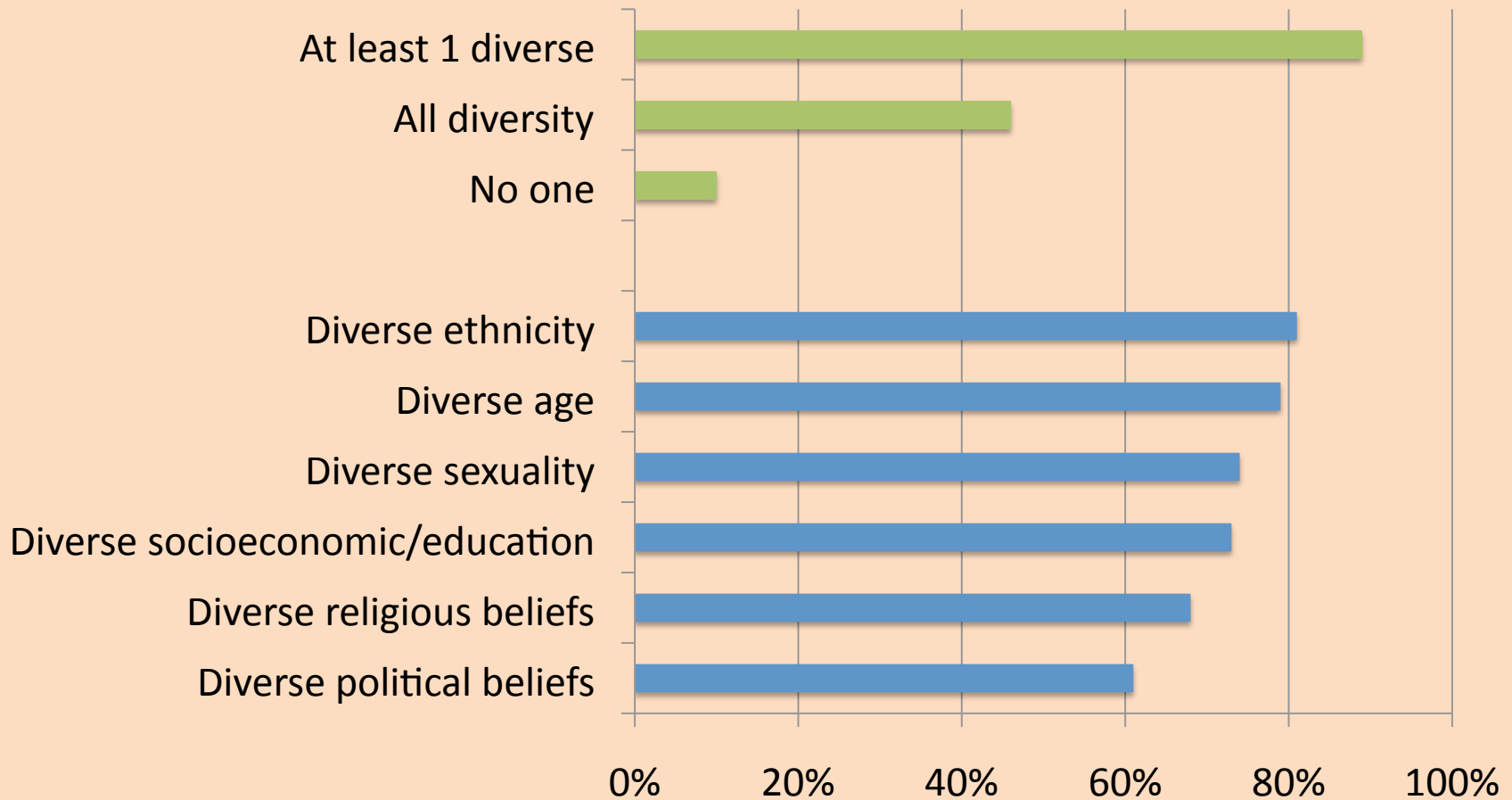


SUMMARY
